

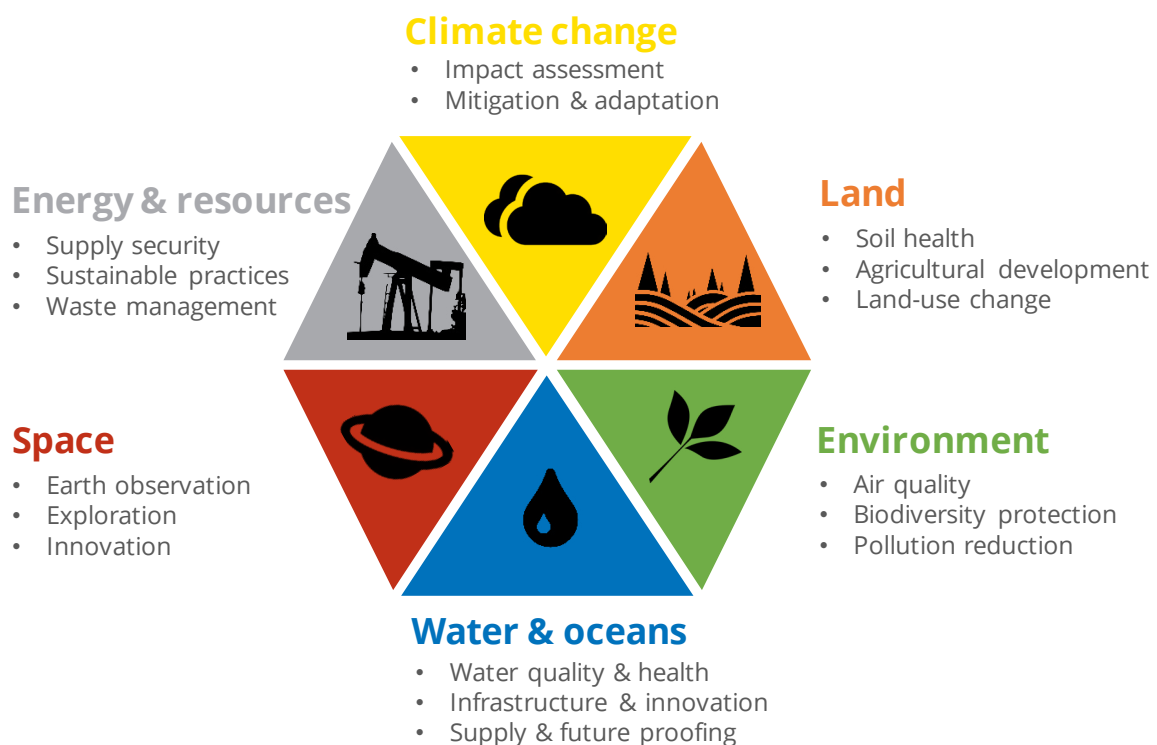


What the EGU can do for policy

The European Geosciences Union (EGU) is Europe's premier geosciences union, dedicated to the pursuit of excellence in the Earth, planetary, and space sciences for the benefit of humanity, worldwide. We are an international union of scientists with about 15,000 members who span many key scientific areas that can enhance the policy-making process. The EGU engages with science for policy activities on a European scale to encourage stronger science-policy partnerships, inform geoscientists about relevant policy opportunities and highlight policy-relevant research to both the public and policymakers. The EGU also publishes a number of open access journals and organises the largest and most prominent European geosciences event, an annual General Assembly with over 14,000 scientists.
